APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

MOTION: Rick Carr made a motion to approve the minutes from the July 1, 2020 meeting, seconded by Jenny Vildibill. All in favor, motion passed 4-0-0.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 2020-21 Budget: The board postponed discussion of the budget due to the budget being presented to council.
- 2. Park Improvements: Discussion continued on the need to replace the playground shovels. The board agreed they need to be removed soon, but replacement will be dependent on the budget.

MOTION: Rick Carr made a motion to buy only 2 replacement shovels if there are funds in the budget, seconded by Jenny Vildibill. All were in favor, motion passed 4-0-0.

3. Signage: There was also discussion about replacing signage on the memorial for Justin Saccone.

MOTION: Rick Carr made a motion to replace the sign, seconded by Daniel Phirman. All in favor, motion passed 4-0-0.

4. Cancelled Events: The board discussed the need to begin planning the Halloween Walk if it were to be held.

MOTION: Rick Carr made a motion to cancel due to the number of uncertainties with Covid-19, seconded by Jenny Vildibill. All in favor, motion passed 4-0-0.

- **5. Shelter Plans:** No action taken at this time due to budget uncertainty.
- 6. Honeysuckle Day: The board discussed whether or not plans for Honeysuckle Day should continue due to Covid-19 and the ability to social distance during the event. No decision was made and discussion will continue at future meetings.
- 7. Tree Guards: Kim Wagner plans to get the tree guards installed very soon.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Secretary Position: Daniel Phirman was nominated for and accepted the vacant secretary position.

- 2. Tree Grant: Ms. Wagner discussed a tree grant through the Campbell County Conservation District. This could be used to replace and supplement existing trees. Discussion to resume when budget details are available.
- 3. New City Property: Mayor Schabell discussed the city's recent purchase of approximately 10 acres of property and future plans for the site. Future plans that may impact the Parks and Recreation Board include a dog park, walking trail and a park/playground. No action needed at this time.
